Founded in 1968 by a group of concerned citizens to oppose an Army Corps of Engineers' proposal to turn Nauset Marsh into a deepwater port, APCC's birth occurred at the dawning of the nation's environmental movementthe same awakening of environmental concern that produced Earth Day, the EPA, the Clean Water Act and the Endangered Species Act. APCC's landmark achievements have resulted in cleaner drinking water, preserved open spaces and restored natural habitats on Cape Cod.

Funding

APCC received startup funding for this project from a number of sources. They include the Massachusetts Environmental Trust (MET), an important supporter of environmental projects and funded by the sale of environmental license plates through the Registry of Motor Vehicles. Over the years, additional funding was provided by a U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Southeast New England Coastal Watershed Restoration Program (SNEP) grant to the Cape Cod Commission, the Friendship Fund, and the Cape Cod Five Foundation. APCC dues and donations now fund the annual updates.

Goals

The Association to Preserve Cape Cod (APCC) is a 501(c)(3) environmental non-profit organization founded in 1968 to promote policies and programs that foster preservation of Cape Cod's natural resources. APCC is a Cape-wide organization with members representing all 15 towns on the Cape. Our goals include protection of water and wetlands; preservation of open space; promotion of responsible, planned growth; and the achievement of an environmental ethic. To achieve these goals, we provide technical assistance, outreach, advocacy, science-based policies and partnership-building. APCC has established itself as the Cape's environmental leader, earning a reputation for effective policies and actions to protect our precious natural resources.

State of the Waters: Cape Cod

The State of the Waters: Cape Cod is an annual assessment of the Cape's water quality, designed to help you understand the water quality problems that we face and the actions that are needed to address these problems. This is a multi-year project in which an annual water health report is provided each year assessing the most recent available water quality data up to and including the previous year.

Achievements

APCC championed the Cape Cod and Islands Water Protection Fund put forward by Senator Julian Cyr and Representative Sarah Peake. It was signed into law as part of the short-term rental tax bill by Governor Charlie Baker in December 2018. The enabling legislation for Cape Cod and the Islands was amended in a supplemental budget signed into law by Governor Baker in March 2019.

APCC is a founding member of the Cape Cod Climate Change Collaborative, which was established in 2016. The Collaborative's mission is to bring the region to net zero carbon emissions by uniting available knowledge, resources, talents and tools and working with various networks representing sectors such as the faith community, transportation, education, the built environment and others.

In 2018, APCC was the first environmental organization in the nation to voice support for the Vineyard Wind offshore wind project south of Martha's Vineyard. In the summer of 2019, APCC convened a gathering of environmental and civic nonprofits and regional leaders in a public show of support for Vineyard Wind when the project was stymied by federal review.

A multi-year project was undertaken by APCC in 2018 to assess existing water quality data and to convey the findings to the public. The results can be found on a dedicated website, CapeCodWaters.org. State of the Waters Cape Cod also has a social media presence on Facebook and a blog. This project continues with annual updates with funding from the Massachusetts Environmental Trust.

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



This year we are now supporting just over 800 students in 28 schools every week. We have expanded beyond elementary schools and now serve many middle schools and upper-level grade students. In 2021-2022 school year, we distributed over 135,000 meals, and since our beginning we have provided over 94,000 weekend bags.



We have nearly 4,000 active members and we provide programs and services that respond to community needs. The YMCA Cape Cod must raise more than \$1.2 Million to fund nutritious meal delivery, affordable childcare, summer camp, and wellness programs that we provide regardless of an individual's ability to pay. From chronic disease management to youth sports to teen achievement programs, the YMCA Cape Cod is open to all and creates spaces where everyone can be, belong and become.

Our Areas of Focus

Youth Development: The YMCA is the region's largest provider of early education and childcare including Head Start and Early Start programming for low-income families. In 2022, we were awarded the Best of the Cape award for early education and camp programs. Our youth offerings include swim classes, sports, after school programming, teen achievement, and community service projects.

Healthy Living: Our wide variety of programs are centered on encouraging good health and preventing disease. We are one of the only affordable pools on the Cape, and programs like Pedaling for Parkinsons, Livestrong Cancer Survivors, and accessible group classes provide important social connection points in addition to the individual wellness benefits of exercise.

Social Responsibility: The YMCA Cape Cod is a community connector and resource. Our Healthy Kids Day provides healthy foods and outdoor fun for 600-800 people. 

Mission

To improve nutritional security on Cape Cod by breaking down the barriers of access to both prepared meals and education, because what gets put in our bodies impacts both physical and mental health and healthier people create healthier communities.

About/Services

The Family Table Collaborative (FTC) distributes nutritious, prepared, free meals directly to

individuals and families. FTC was created in March 2020 as a rapid response program to address the immediate needs of families and seniors who struggled with food security due to the COVID-19 pandemic and has grown into a social enterprise which focuses on feeding people nutritionally dense, delicious meals, through teaming up with Community Partners, reducing waste and increasing sustainability. Their model combines social entrepreneurship and business sense to create real, sustainable change, because not all food is created equally and it matters. Beyond their capital campaign with sights to buy the property and build out their offerings, profits derived from The Commons at Riverway (events, marketplace,

pop ups) will be reinvested to run, sustain and grow the Family Table Collaborative.

Stats

FTC, which has grown from 150 volunteers in 2022 to over 400 volunteers in 2023, has prepared and distributed more than 110,000 meals and put over 25,000 lbs of rescued produce into our community.
